## NEW YORK

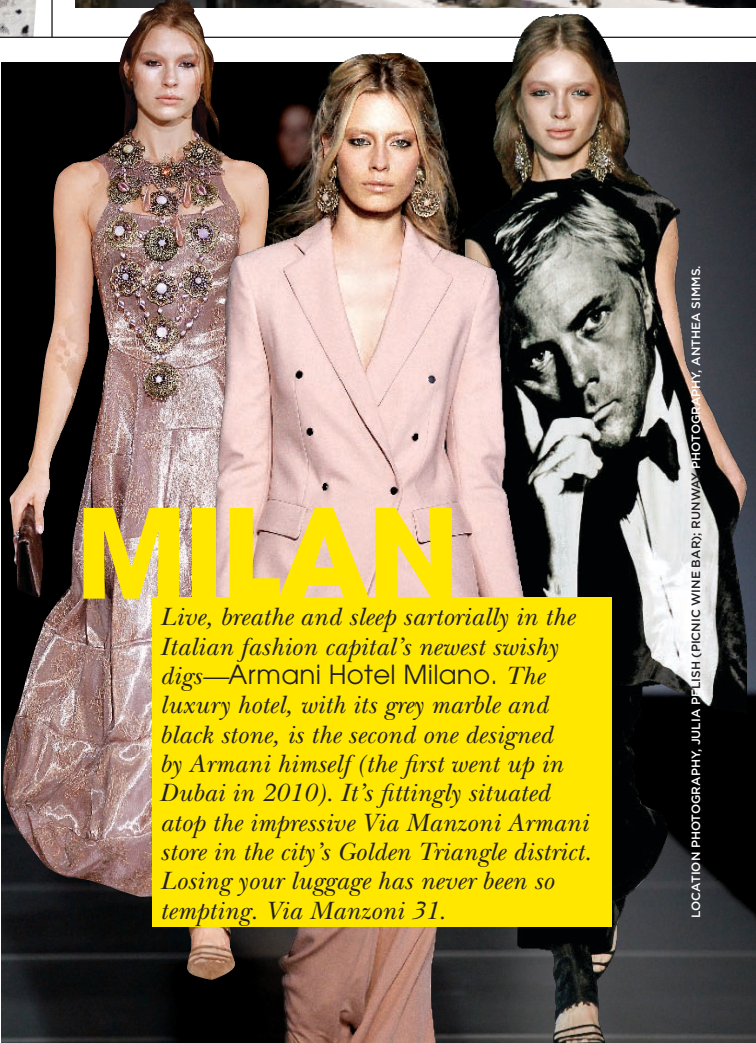
